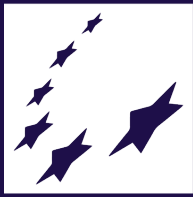

EUNIC London (European Union National Institutes for Culture) is the network of the cultural institutes and embassies from the member states of the European Union in London. A branch of EUNIC Global, the London network was established in 2007 and has at present 36 members.

HARVESTING YOUNG CREATIVITY

Harvesting Young Creativity was a EUNIC London project organised in partnership with Young at Art, Belfast Children's Festival. Over the duration of the festival, 3-12 March 2023, *Harvesting Young Creativity* brought visionary festival leaders and artists from across Europe, together with local Northern Ireland counterparts in order to participate in captivating panel discussions, workshops and performances.

The project included two panel discussions:

- **Opening Worlds: How to further engage with the local community? Reach versus Depth of Impact** with artists and experts Filu Sampé, Justinas Vancevicius, Inna Siemicz, and Veerle Kerckhoven. Moderated by Belinda McElhanney, Chief Executive of Imagineate. This took place on Friday 3 March, 3:15-4:45pm at Oh Yeah Music Centre, Belfast. Event attendances: 103
- **Why Do We Need Festivals? How to stay innovative in the world of children's festivals?** with experts Stefan Hansen, Laura Kauppinen, Suzanne Verboeket and Maria Steiner. Moderated by Tony Reekie, Director of Catherine Wheels – that took place on Sunday 5 March, 10:00- 11:30am at Oh Yeah Music Centre, Belfast. Event attendances: 79

Both panel discussions were part of the Delegate programme of the 2023 homegrown Northern Ireland Showcase at the 25th Belfast Children's Festival. The total *homegrown* Showcase delegates were 76.

It also included two workshops:

- **Theatre Props making workshop** with the Lithuanian artists Antanas Dubra and Vladas Suncovas that took place on Saturday 11 March at Belfast City Hall and the Cathedral Quarter.
- **Illustration workshop** with the Polish artist and graphic designer Piotr Socha that took place on Sunday 12 March at The MAC.

All workshops took place on the last weekend of the festival 11-12 March 2023.

A performance by the **North Belfast Youth Choir** also took place on 3 March 2023, at 2pm at Oh Yeah Music Centre, Belfast.

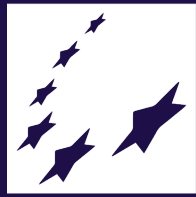

IN SHORT, EUROPE: AWAKENING

LEEDS EDITION, 21- 22 APRIL 2023

The fifth edition of *In Short, Europe* European short film festival organised by EUNIC London in collaboration with the European Union Delegation to the UK, LEEDS 2023, Leeds International Film Festival and the Institut Français du Royaume-Uni, took place at Everyman Cinemas in Leeds on the 21st – 22nd April 2023 and at the Ciné Lumière in London on the 12th -13th May 2023.

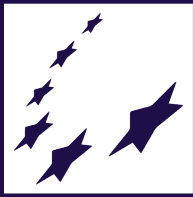
This edition, entitled *Awakening*, was organised over two days and was curated into four strands: **Explore, Grow, Surround and Dream**, inviting audiences to imagine new beginnings, reflect on their past experiences and dare to dream of a brighter future.

The programme was curated by Ellie Hales, Film Programmer at Leeds International Film Festival and included 24 invigorating short films from all around Europe.

On Friday 21 April, the festival opened in Leeds with a special screening of the BAFTA and Oscar award winning short film *An Irish Goodbye* directed by Tom Berkeley & Ross White, followed by a discussion with Christine Morrow (New and Emerging Talent Executive, Northern Ireland Screen) and a drinks reception.

The festival was launched by H.E. Pedro Serrano, the EU Ambassador to the UK. In his opening speech, Ambassador Serrano remarked how symbolic it was to bring this festival to Leeds, the city where, in 1888, Frenchman Augustin Le Prince captured some of the first surviving moving images. Ūla Tornau, Lithuanian Cultural Attache and EUNIC co-president and Ellie Hales, the Festival 's Curator also welcomed audiences to the festival.

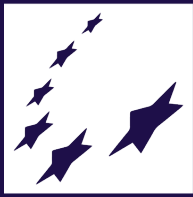

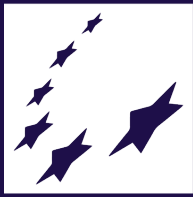

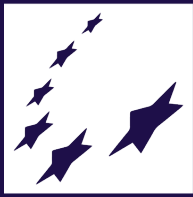
THE STORIES WE TELL
